With over 10,000+ views, our I Wish I knew initiative is a series of reels that provide insight into several different undergraduate programs in Canada. Made by students currently in these programs, this series aims to increase transparency about admission processes and requirements for Canadian science undegraduate programs.

LET'S TALK BIOTECH

Featuring 10 speakers including program coordinators from SickKids and representatives from Hoffman-La Roche, this online conference presented students with the opportunity to learn extensively about the field of biotech and network with professionals. Topics ranged from synthetic biology in medicine to opportunities available for undergraduate students.



The PuMP Foundation scholarship awards 2 aspiring physicians with a \$500 scholarship to support them through the costs of applying to medical school. By doing so, we aim to support those faced with financial difficulties on their journey into the field of medicine.

As an expansion of our flagship event, PuMP+, PuMP X is a STEM fair targeting undergraduate students featuring research, service, industry, and students for students booths. These booths were able to showcase the various opportunities and programs they offer.

PuMP X also hosted a variety of students in graduate and professional programs who were able to share their experiences and help students solidify their career paths.



POWER STEM Fellowship

Through our partnership with charity STEM Fellowship, this free mentorship program runs annually and provides Grade 11 and 12 students with an interest in pursuing the biological sciences the opportunity to be paired with a Canadian university student mentor, who they meet with to ask questions about scholarships, post-secondary applications, university life, curricula, and more.

Established in 2018 as PuMP's first branch, PuMP Toronto strives to make a difference in the health science community by connecting students with opportunities, encouraging community involvement, and creating transparency. Our team consists of 30 dedicated highschool and university students across the GTA working together to organize and host enriching online and in-person initiatives.

PUMP'S anatomy

PuMP's Anatomy, was a free in-person CPR training course where attendees had the opportunity to receive official CPR-A certifications. The course was taught by youth certified CPR instructors and attendees expanded their knowledge on topics like the goals of first aid and primary assessment. Attendees also watched a medical drama, Chicago Med, while a cardiology resident debunked common medical drama myths and provided insights on real-life situations in healthcare.



PuMPed for POST-SECONDARY

This online presentation provided high school students with vital information about the specifics of applying to university, university life, nuances of undergraduate research as well insight on graduate/medical school applications. Additionally, a booth was hosted at our board's PuMP+ later in the term.

Established in May 2020, our branch has welcomed 100+ students in the Lower Mainland whether as a student volunteer or as a participant to a range of our events. With a growing team of 28 members, our branch aims to increase awareness about the diverse pathways in the medical and biological sciences. Our branch hopes to bring these opportunities to our first in-person PuMP+ event in the Spring of 2024.

STEM STORIES

University applications season pose uncertainty for many students. To increase transparency, our branch hosted a multi-part Instagram takeover with students from a range of Canadian university programs. These takeovers showcased a typical day in the life of these students. Moreover, these takeovers provided tangible and invaluable information.

CRACK THE CASE

This mini series of medical case studies consisted of 4 episodes featuring 4 rising Canadian medical students. Held remotely, this provided the opportunity for students Vancouver-wide to gain exposure to the mechanics of a medical diagnosis. Students were able to develop their problem-solving, critical thinking and collaborative skills.

The Case

Mr. Blue is a 55-year-old man with a history of type 2 diabetes mellitus, hypertension and hyperlipidemia. He presents himself at your office because he has been experiencing chest pain for several days, but has been refluctant to come to the office. He first noted it 6 weeks ago while shoveling snow. The discomfort was mid-sternal and radiated to his jaw. It resolved with rest. Since then he has noted 3 similar episodes each occurring while climbing the 2 flights of stairs from his basement to the bedroom.


Upon further questioning, he also tells you that he feels cramps in both of his calves wheneve he walks for more than 500 meters. If he stops walking, his symptoms resolve within 2-3 minutes.

On examination, he is mildly obese. His pedal artery and posterior tibial artery pulses are significantly decreased in volume bilaterally. The remainder of the examination is normal.




The PuMP Ottawa branch was established in June 2021. Through this past year our team was composed of 20 high-school and university students. During this term, our branch was able to put together two virtual events, Researchify and our annual PuMP+, for our local Ottawa community. Our branch also focused on building an online presence that provided accessible information on medical pathways and undergraduate program offerings across postsecondary institutions in Ottawa.

RESEARCHIFY

OTTAWA january 2023

Researchify, a virtual event exposed students to research careers in the health sciences. It featured a guest speaker from Newborn Screening Ontario and interactive workshops on common genetic tests performed in labs. The two workshops allowed students to analyze and understand biological data. The first workshop consisted of an informational seminar on literature and genetic biological data. The second workshop highlighted genetics and provided students with an indepth look into how alleles and genetics work form our individual identities. The workshop was concluded with a foray into the world of forensic science with an interactive murder mystery.




